Yule Customs in the Middle Ages

Yule is a winter festival originally celebrated by pagan Germanic people. The religious celebration was held in late December to early January, but later was absorbed into the festival of Christmas on December 25 as Northern Europe became Christianized.

The burning of a large wooden log in the hearth became part of traditional Yule celebrations in several European countries. The Yule log, like mistletoe, may have been part of the pagan ceremonies. The log itself was intended to symbolize the triumph over evil spirits, and a spark from last year's log was said to be preserved to light the next year's log.

Wassail, from Middle English meaning "be healthy", was the act of toasting the gods with a hot, spiced drink. Historical wassail drinks were likely to be beer or mead, heated and mulled with sugar, ginger, nutmeg, cinnamon, then topped with slices of toast as sops. Wassailing was the practice of going from door to door, singing carols, and exchanging blessings and goodwill for food and drink.

One of the most interesting customs of Medieval England was the election or appointment of a Lord of Misrule who led the festivities of the Yule season with much drinking and merry making, masques, mummeries and music. In the great houses and universities each Lord of Misrule was charged with designing and supervising the Yule entertainments and revelries. In small town and villages the Lord of Misrule was often elected to lead more boisterous celebrations, presiding over the Feast of Fools. This celebration included drunkenness and wild partying, in the tradition of the Roman Saturnalia, from which it may have been derived.

The association of the fir tree with the Yule began in Germany almost 1000 years ago when St. Boniface converted the German people to Christianity. He was said to have come across a group of pagans worshipping an oak tree, and in anger, cut it down. To everyone's amazement a young fir tree sprang up from the roots of the oak. This was taken as a sign of Christianity overcoming the pagan religions. In the late middle Ages, Germans and Scandinavians placed evergreen trees inside their homes or just outside their doors to show their hope in the coming spring.

Legend has it that Martin Luther began the tradition of decorating trees to celebrate the Yule. On a crisp Christmas Eve in the year of 1500, he was walking through a snow-covered wood and was struck with the beauty of a group of small fir trees,



As the weather cools, those people in our community who have fallen on hard times are in need of basic necessities like blankets and coats to see them through the winter season. I hope you will join me by donating commonly used household items for the homeless at the Central Arizona Shelter Services. CASS provides a total of 415 beds for single men and women at their main shelter each night and 30 apartments for homeless families. Last year, CASS served 4580 unduplicated homeless men, women and children. Their greatest needs are for blankets, new socks and coats (all sizes).

dusted with snow and shimmering in the moonlight. When he got home, he set up a little fir tree indoors and decorated it with candles so he could share his experience with his children. They lighted the candles in honor of Christ's birth.


Decorated trees quickly became popular in much of Europe. There are records of a Christmas tree erected in the Cathedral of Strasbourg in 1539, and in Bremen in 1570 where guild members placed a small fir decorated with apples, nuts, dates, pretzels and paper flowers in their guild hall for their children. At the German Christmas markets bakers sold shaped gingerbreads and wax ornaments, and real silver tinsel was first used in Germany in 1610.

St. Nicholas was a Christian saint and bishop, born in Myra (in what is now Turkey) in 270 and died in Myra on Dec. 6, 346. He is the patron saint of children, sailors, fishermen, merchants, the falsely accused, repentant thieves, pharmacists, archers, and pawnbrokers. Known for helping the poor, he had a reputation for secret gift-giving, leaving coins in the shoes of those who left them out for him. After he died, people continued to give anonymous gifts to the poor, attributing them to Saint Nicholas. It is reported that medieval nuns used the night of December 6 to anonymously leave baskets of food and clothes at the doorsteps of the needy.

The Dutch name for Saint Nicholas is Sinterklaas, and modern day Dutch children leave their shoes beside the chimney on the night of December 5 with hay and carrots in them for Saint Nicholas' horse. (If they have been good, they receive small presents in their shoes the next morning. If they have been naughty, they are stolen away in sacks to Spain, from which they believe Sinterklaas comes.) Clearly, the images of Saint Nicholas have changed over the years, but he still remains a symbol of charity to the poor and gifts to children.




