Come over the Thorpe Adult Center on Tuesday October 11th and hang out, do some heraldry, or put your creative side to work helping to draw devices. The workshop starts at 6PM. Once again, We'll have some computers with Us to speed the process. We are actively looking for feedback about what people would like to do at A&S. We have a LOT of talent locally and We would prefer to offer topics that the populace really wants rather than choosing random topics. Her Excellency will also be bringing some examples of some of her favorite largesse.

Speaking of largesse, it was obvious at Our last populace meeting that some folks do not understand what largesse is, or why We need it. The Barons and Baronesses, as representatives of their Barony are expected to provide gift baskets for their Majesties at Coronation. The baskets are supposed to contain small gifts which are appropriate for their Majesties to give to other Royals and individuals. These gifts are called largesse. They can be as simple as a bookmark, or a handmade note card, or as elaborate as hand embroidered mug covers, or handwoven trim. In addition to Coronation, We are expected to provide gift baskets whenever another Baron and Baroness are invested. We have personally provided items of largesse that ranged from homebrew, to hand dipped candles, sucades, and bookmarks. In addition to providing gifts for the other Royals, largesse is an excellent opportunity for individuals to be recognized for their talents. We encourage any artisan who donates an item to include a tag with their name and the name of the Barony. It is important that the rest of the Kingdom see how talented our local people are. If the Kingdom does not see your work, it is very difficult to gain any kind of Kingdom recognition for it.

Northern Atenveldt Archery Practice was a lot of fun. Archers who had equipment and wanted to shoot a LOT got their wish! Several participants achieved new rankings. Her Excellency made

Bowman after more than 12 years of not touching Her equipment. Seventeen stalwart archers from as far away as the Marches of Wealhnutu wore their fingers out shooting. The weather was nice, and the wind was mild for Northern Atenveldt!

We will be attending Coronation and are looking for people who are willing to act as Her Excellency's Guards. If you are interested, please contact Lord Janquith or Her Excellency. The Board policy on kingdom electronic newsletters (e-newsletters) is scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2012, with the first e-newsletter available being the March, 2012 issue. Here are some of the important details of this policy.

- All paid Sustaining and International members will have access to all SCA, Inc. kingdom e-newsletters via a password-protected website, even if they choose to continue receiving paper newsletters.

- All kingdom newsletters will be 8.5"x11" with a uniform page count to allow all the paper newsletters to be sent in one bulk mailing.
- Within each kingdom, the paper and electronic newsletters will contain the same information, but the kingdom will have the option of including a supplemental PDF of articles, photo essays, art, etc. for the newsletters website.
- Once the link to the e-newsletter website is available on www.sca.org (after January 1, 2012), you may discontinue your paper newsletter, no matter where you are in your membership cycle. However, please be aware that no refunds can be issued if you choose to do so.
- An e-newsletter will not constitute proof of membership.

- ⤴ Participate in one of three styles of combat (armored, rapier, or archery) – Please remember that while you are only required to fight in one style, you are welcome to compete in more
- ⤴ Dance

Those competing for Baronial Champion will also need to select one of the following two categories to compete in:

- Bardic
- Voice Heraldry

Chatelaine/Steward Competition Categories

All those wishing to compete for Chatelaine/Steward of the Barony of SunDragon must submit a letter of intent to their Excellencies. *This letter must be done in Calligraphy.* In addition, they are required to compete in the following categories:

- ⤴ "Dreaded Written Test"
- ⤴ Interview with Their Excellencies
- ⤴ Voice Heraldry

Those competing for Chatelaine/Steward will also need to select three of the following four categories to compete in:

- Dance
- Dessert (can be made ahead of time and brought to site)
- Heraldic Display (can be made ahead of time and brought to site)
- Embroidery (can be made ahead of time and brought to site) – You can select a 3x3 inch design of your own or ask to have one provided to you
