Being Baron and Baroness is both rewarding and difficult. The happiest part of being the Landed Nobility of Ered Sul comes from you, the members of the Barony. Each of you contributes something to the Barony. Whether you are an "old hand" or a newcomer to the SCA, fun is what you make of your participation. It doesn't take a lot of money and it needn't take tremendous time. But to get something out, you have to put something in – participate.

And remember, we LOVE to give out awards, but to get an award you need to earn one! No show= no cookie! There are often rides available to events, but if you don't ask in a timely fashion...

Guidelines for Baronial Letters of Intent and Baronial Polling

Letters of Intent

Unto the populace of the Barony of Ered Sul: Their Excellencies Henry and Eirny will soon complete their warrant. Therefore, in accordance with Kingdom Law, The Crown is accepting Letters of Intent, from qualified couples, who wish to be considered as candidates for the position of Baron and Baroness. To be eligible for this position, candidates must be paid members of the SCA and reside within the zip codes assigned to the Barony of Ered Sul. Letters of Intent should be sent to the Crown with copies to the Kingdom Seneschal and the current Baron and Baroness of Ered Sul. Letters may be sent by either US Mail or email.

Letters of intent must be received by February 13, 2014.

- The following information must be included in your Letter of Intent:
- Full contact information that includes both modern and SCA names, complete mailing address, phone number(s), and email addresses
- Proof of current membership
- A statement of your reasons for seeking the position
- A statement of your plans and dreams for the future of the Barony
- A brief statement of your history of participation in the Barony and within the SCA
- A statement that you fully understand the responsibilities of the positions of Baron and Baroness and that you are willing to commit to a three year term of office
- A statement that you understand that, if accepted as a candidate by the Crown, your Letter of Intent will be published in your baronial newsletter.

Polling

A polling of the current paid members of the Barony of Ered Sul will be conducted on April 13, 2014 at Joe C. Montoya Community & Senior Center, 245 N. Thorpe Rd., Flagstaff, AZ 86001. The polling will begin at noon and will run until 1:30 PM. If the results of that polling do not show a clear preference, a second run-off polling will be held immediately following the closing and tabulation of ballots from the first poll. Members are encouraged to remain onsite should a second poll be necessary.

To participate in the polling, you must possess a valid SCA membership that is listed in the zip codes assigned to the Barony of Ered Sul and be eighteen years of age or older.

Current membership will be verified on a membership list at the polling site, or you may present an online membership renewal confirmation that is dated after the Milpitas Registry Office list was generated. A driver's license or government picture ID will also be required to be shown to prove age and identity.

Absentee Ballots

Proxy ballots are NOT allowed. If you are unable to attend the polling, you may follow the procedures below to submit an Absentee Ballot Letter. No exceptions will be made to the timeline or contents for an Absentee ballot to be counted, so review the requirements carefully, and send your letters in as soon as the candidates are announced. You must write a letter to the Kingdom Seneschal stating your preference in the poll. Your absentee ballot must be RECEIVED by [April 3rd](#) to be counted. DO NOT require a signature at delivery on a mailed ballot, as that will delay delivery. If there is a second polling, absentee ballots will only be counted if the preferred candidates remain in the run-off polling. Your letter must include ALL of the following:

The names of one and only one couple you prefer as candidates, or a statement that you do not support any of the candidates.

Modern and SCA name and the mailing address for your membership, including zip code.

Proof of membership (Any one of membership number, photocopy of membership card, photocopy of Southwind label, photocopy of confirmation printout from online membership renewal)

Photocopy of a driver's license or government ID showing your modern name, zip code, and proof that you are 18 years of age or older.

The game is played on a rectangular field. At both ends, in each of the corners a base square is
laid out. Base A is in the upper right hand corner and Base B is in the lower right corner.
Opposite end of the field the bases are reversed, Base A is in the lower left corner and Base B is
in the upper left hand corner. Base A and B on the right side of the field represent the team's
prison and the opposite side of the field their freedom.

The game is played with two Captains and two Lieutenants, each with ten players. Both teams
start with all of their team members in prison. The Captains are both placed in the center of the

field. The Lieutenants to the sidelines, only one prisoner can try and escape from their prison at a time. They must avoid being tackled by the opposing Captain and make it to their freedom square on the opposite side of the field. If they are brought to ground, they go back to prison to wait their turn to try an escape again, and the next prisoner attempts to escape. The Captains can choose to be replaced by their Lieutenant (but only once during the course of play). The team who gets all of their prisoners out of prison and into the freedom square first wins.

Shuttlecock was played with a cork with feathers stuck into it and was batted about by a wooden paddle, later to developed into paddles strung with fiber. With the addition of a net, shuttlecock became badminton. Bocci ball has its origin in period lawn bowling games which involved each player rolling a ball down the lawn and trying to knock over his opponent's cone in the fewest moves. There were several variants of croquet in the middle ages known as Ring-Ball, Club-Ball and Trap Ball.

Chess was invented in India, spread by the Persians and by the eleventh century made it into every upper class home in Europe. Backgammon has its ancient roots in Roman times, and it too was spread throughout the Mediterranean and was introduced into Europe. As with chess, many, many versions were in existence. The earliest mention of dominoes is from Song Dynasty China. Dominoes first appeared in Italy during the 18th century. It is speculated that Italian missionaries in China may have brought the game to Europe.

Rules of the field are standard Atenveldt Cut and Thrust conventions (thrusts, tip cuts, draw cuts, and percussive cuts). The fighter with the most total bouts won will be declared the victor.

Allowable Weapons: Maximum blade length for single handed weapons is 38 inches as

measured forward of the quillons/guard. Two handed weapons will be judged on a case by case basis, but must be used as two handed and not just to increase length of reach. Atenveldt allowable blade conventions will be observed. Parrying devices, armor, and weapons will be inspected before each tournament by Tournament Marshals and designees. Armor standards are those of your home kingdom. All authorized rapier fighters must provide proof of their authorization in Heavy Rapier / Cut & Thrust Rapier, or else have a Marshal from their Kingdom vouch for them.
